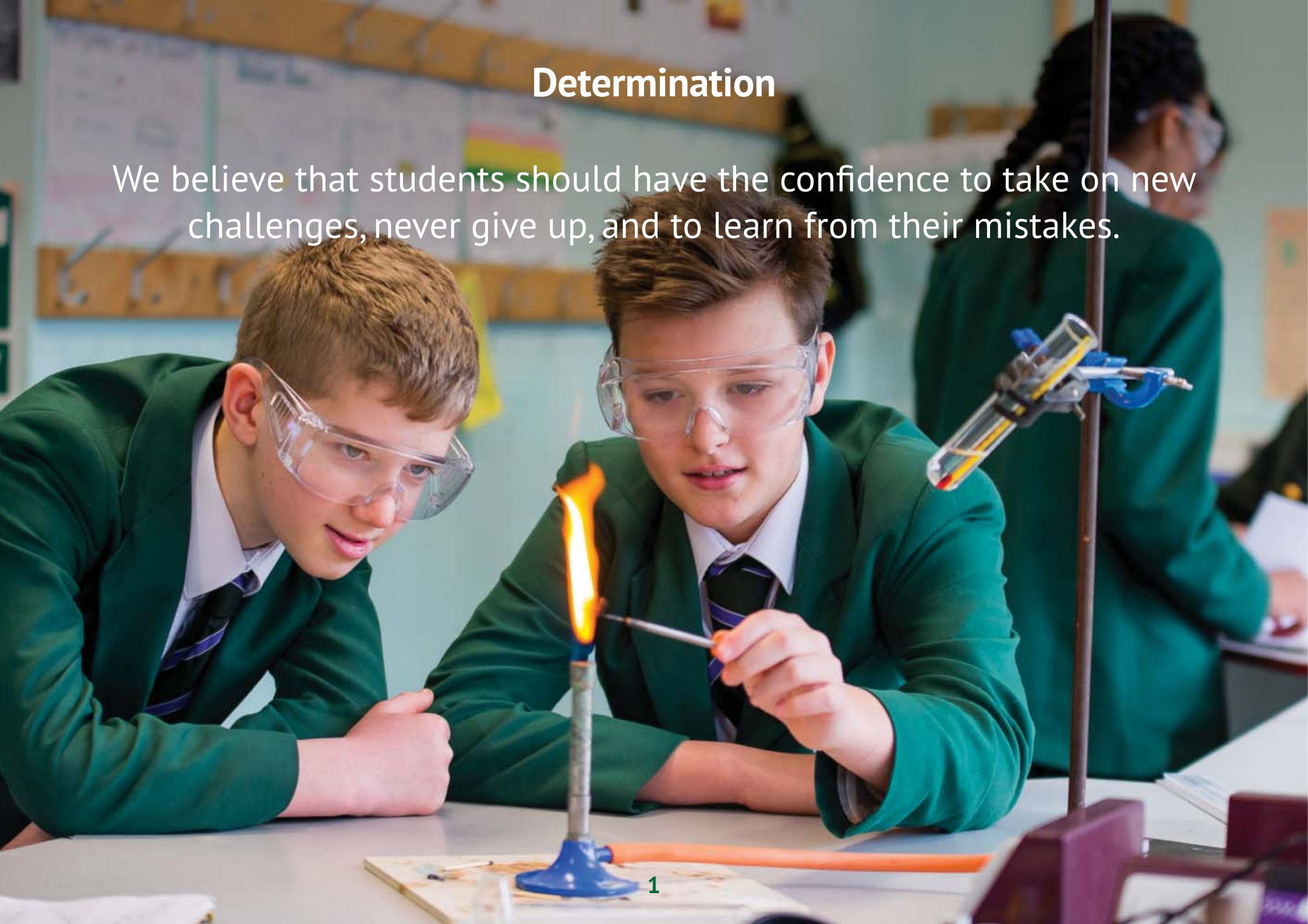

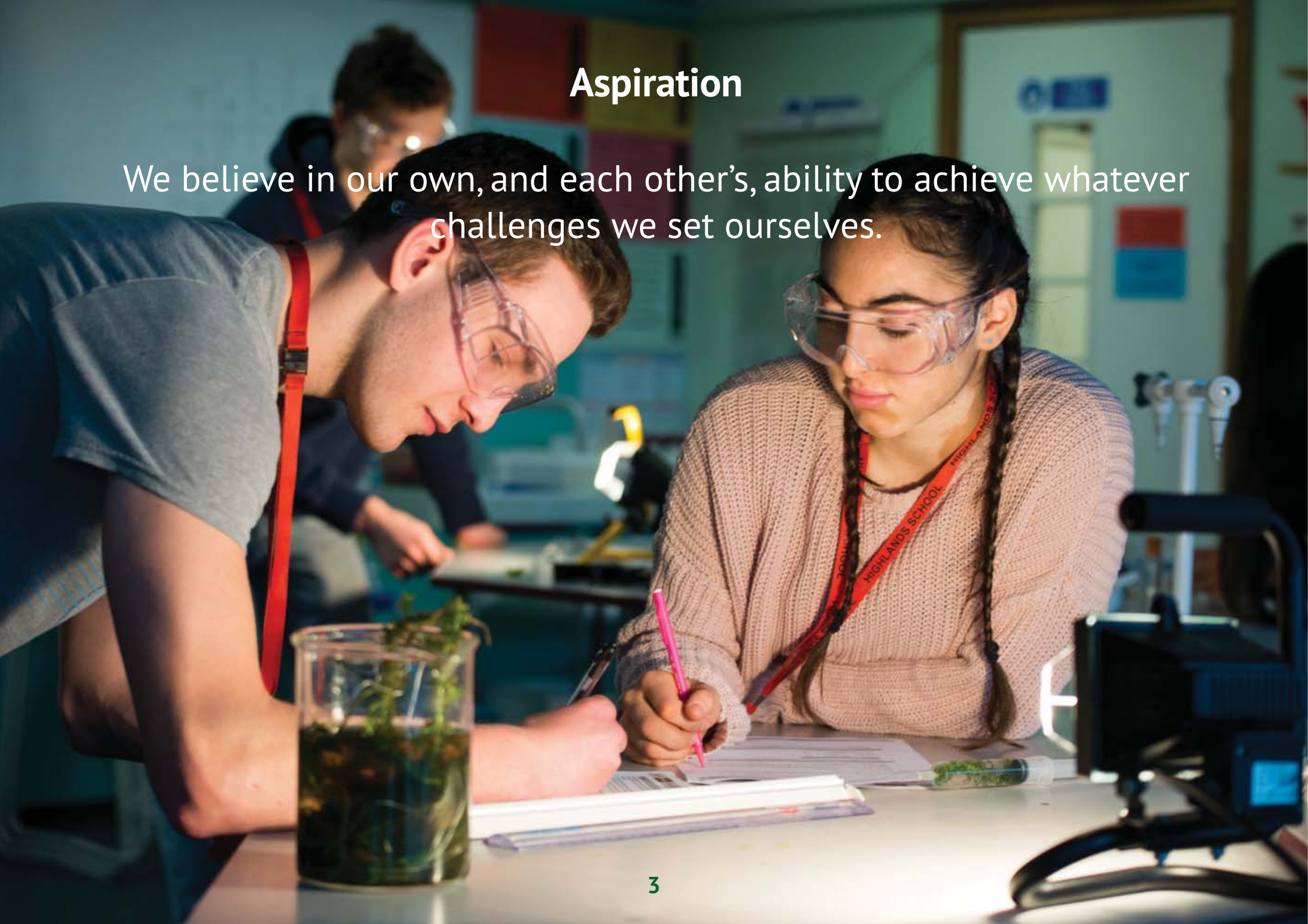
Our pastoral team works tirelessly to provide appropriate support for individuals' differing educational and social needs. We have a strong pastoral team consisting of Heads of Year, Behaviour Mentors, Assistant Headteachers, Deputy Headteachers and a dedicated School Counsellor.

We aim to provide a caring environment for all students and to help them quickly feel at home in the school. Older students are trained as 'mentors' to support and guide the younger students. We also pride ourselves on creating a strong ethos of co-operation with parents and carers which emphasises clear communication between home and school.

Transition

As the move from primary school to secondary school is a big change for children, we run a dedicated programme to ensure this transition is as smooth as possible. The Head of Year 7 visits many of the main feeder primary schools to meet with the teachers and to find out more about the new students joining Highlands School. Parents are also invited to attend information mornings at Highlands to help clarify what to expect and how we can work together successfully.

To get students excited about joining us, all new students are invited in for a Taster Day in July, where they get to experience a day at Highlands.

All year 7 students start the school year one day earlier than the older years. This builds students' confidence and enables them to establish relationships with their form tutors and with their peers. Year 7 students take lunch before the other years groups. The transition programme therefore enables students to begin their time at Highlands with confidence.

Respect

We believe in working individually, and with others, to uphold the rules and laws of our community. We believe that this should be done whilst respecting the views of others.



Learning Beyond the Classroom

Highlands School is committed to offering students a wide range of learning contexts in order to develop all aspects of their abilities, talents and interests.

We offer a range of residential visits to Europe and beyond, including skiing, sports, historical visits and cultural exchanges. Each faculty offers a range of day and/or evening visits to events which will enhance learning and illustrate different aspects of the curriculum. Students are also encouraged to participate in the Duke of Edinburgh programme to develop their independence.

We have dedicated Wednesday afternoons to our 'Ed-Extra' programme, which all year 7 pupils are required to attend. This programme offers a range of activities including boxing, football, cooking, journalism club and debating club. Older years are also encouraged to participate in these activities.

The PE department run a timetable of sports clubs throughout the year which includes a range of activities for all students. Highlands have a number of highly successful sports teams. The girls' U14 football team are currently Middlesex champions. We have had teams representing London at the National Futsal Finals. Highlands students are also lucky enough to frequently represent Enfield at the London Youth Games in a number of sports.

These activities allow students the chance to not only explore new interests, but to develop interpersonal, social and collaborative skills which are essential for a successful working life. The knowledge, skills and competencies gained through these 'Ed-Extra' activities are essential for the complete development of young people and we value them highly.

Highlands School is a Teaching School, the lead school within the Pan Enfield Alliance - a group of primary and secondary schools in Enfield. The Key Stage Three curriculum has recently been extended into year 9.
