

Headteacher's News

This is the final newsletter of the year and I would like to thank all the staff, students, parents and carers at Highlands School for their hard work and support this term. Inside this week's newsletter are details of the end of term and of our Christmas jumper day, taking place on Thursday 19th December.

Next week Mr Feldman is leaving Highlands School. Mr Feldman has worked at Highlands since September 2009 and, as the deputy headteacher responsible for curriculum, he played a key role in the excellent results and successful OFSTED inspections that the school has achieved over the time he has been here. I would like to thank him for the hard work and support that he has given the school and we all wish him the very best in future.

In January we will be re-focusing on behaviour at Highlands and I will be speaking to students about this in assemblies. I would like you to emphasise with your children that, as a school, we have the highest expectations of behaviour and that those who put at risk the wellbeing or education of other members of the school community will put their place at our school in jeopardy. On this theme I want to provide clarity and reassurance regarding an incident that took place at school last week. During lunch time on Wednesday it came to our attention that some students had sprayed a substance that had a bad smell and was causing some other students and members of staff to cough. We immediately ensured that all pupils were sent outside into the fresh air while we ventilated the area. We conducted health and safety checks before ensuring it was safe for staff and students to enter the building again. We have identified the students responsible for this and they are being dealt with accordingly.

We are hoping to raise in excess of £1000 on this day, which we should easily achieve if students bring their £1 donations in. These can be given to their form tutor during morning registration time.


