Headteacher's introduction

OFSTED

On Tuesday and Wednesday this week OFSTED inspected Highlands School. The inspection was not a 'Section 5' inspection (the type of inspection OFSTED uses to grade the overall effectiveness of a school). This was a 'Section 8' inspection, looking at certain aspects of the school's work. The inspection was unannounced, which is why the school community was not informed about the inspection the day before. The OFSTED inspection was a rigorous experience but we are a school that welcomes robust, expert challenge. I want to particularly pay tribute to our students; on Tuesday morning dozens of lessons were visited to look at behaviour and there were virtually no incidents of low level disruption. At that time, we had not told the students OFSTED were at school; this was just 'business as usual'. Our students spoke with confidence about how the school keeps them safe. We have worked hard on behaviour since I became the headteacher at Highlands. We have done this because we believe that all students have the right to attend a school where they feel safe, are free from bullying and discrimination and can grow academically, socially and emotionally. During the inspection the behaviour and attitudes of students during lessons and whilst moving between lessons was excellent. As normal, there was virtually no litter or graffiti around the site. The way students started and ended the day was excellent. When we reflect on the journey we have been on over the last three years, we should be very proud. My thanks, and that of the governors, go to our students and staff for the high standards they hold themselves to every day, whether or not the school is being inspected.

OFSTED always ask that the findings of their inspections are not shared until they formally write to us and publish their report on the website. This will happen either during the summer or in September. We remain ready for our next scheduled 'Section 5' inspection, whenever it occurs.

SPORTS DAY - MONDAY 19TH JULY 2021



Highlands School will be holding the annual sports day for years 7 – 10 and year 12 on Monday 19th July 2021.

All students should arrive at 8.30am for registration at 8.40am which is earlier than the normal time for years 7, 8 and 9. Students should make their way to the tennis courts/astro to be registered. Students should attend sports day in Highlands School PE kit.

We are due to finish by approximately 12.15 pm. It is compulsory that every student is to attend the day and it is hoped that everyone will compete in at least two events on the day (one athletic, one team). However, if it is not possible for a student to actively take part then we suggest that they assist by helping form tutors or officiating.

Please note that there will be no school based activities on this day. Students attending the sixth form will be given a role and expected to help staff run the day.

Students should bring in a packed lunch with a large bottle of water to rehydrate for the day. Students should also wear and bring sun cream if it is a hot day. Students who receive free school meals will be able to collect a packed lunch from the school canteen at the start of the day from 8.30am.

It is essential that students do not bring any unnecessary valuables as there will be nowhere to lock them away. Students should attend the day in Highlands School PE kit only. If students have any existing issues with their PE kit they should make their behaviour mentor for their year group aware before the day.

If the event has to be cancelled due to adverse weather, students will attend normal lessons and go home after their lunch time, these finish times will be slightly different to the sports day schedule. If you are wishing to collect your son/daughter from school you may do so but you will need to arrive promptly and if driving, please park away from the school.

If it is deemed necessary to change these arrangements due to the weather, every effort will be made to inform parents by text and school website as early as possible.

Unfortunately this year we are unable to have guests for the day but would like to thank you in advance for your support in getting students prepared.










How to support our school:


