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## <u>PE KIT</u>

At Highlands school we have high expectations for students with regards to their uniform and PE kit, and we wanted to clarify the requirements for pupils on the days when they have PE and attend school in their PE kit. **Students are only expected to wear a full PE kit that has been purchased from our suppliers John Lyon or Smith's** (details are on the **school website**).
