#### Easter revision school update

Easter revision school begins Tuesday 6th April 2021 for the final year exam students in yr 10-11 who signed up via the booking form last weekend. Arrival times and end times;

Students are expected to arrive at school 10 minutes before each session is due to begin. If students arrive late they may not be able to access the building. Arrival for morning revision sessions - 9:50 (the session is from 10:00-11:30) Arrival for afternoon revision sessions - 12:05 (the session is from 12:15-13:45) Teachers leading the revision sessions will meet students at the main reception and will take them to the relevant classroom.



## STUDENT EQUIPMENT

From 19th April 2021 whiteboard pens will become a part of student equipment that will need replacing at their expense, in the same way as other pens and pencils.
