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Headteacher's introduction

Parent and carer survey

We are asking parents and carers to take part in our annual school survey. This year our survey is being conducted by an external agency that we are working with on a special project to celebrate 20 years of Highlands School being open. As part of this project the governors and leaders of the school are reviewing all aspects of the school to find out what is working well and should be kept, and what could be improved or refreshed. That is why, in the second part of the survey, there are questions about perceptions of the personality or character of the school, and about the school uniform. The responses to this survey will be presented to the leaders and governors along with the results of other forms of research and will play a part in shaping our school for the next 20 years.

Safeguarding at Highlands School

At Highlands we ask experts in different areas of school leadership and education to come and work with us so that we can draw on their expertise to improve our school. Last week Angela Corbett, a former OFSTED HMI and expert in safeguarding, carried out a three day review of safeguarding at Highlands. She met with governors, senior leaders, staff, students and she reviewed our policies and key safeguarding documents. OFSTED judge safeguarding at schools to be either effective, or not effective. We were pleased that Angela judged our safeguarding to be effective and highlighted many areas of strength. She also, as we hoped she would, made recommendations to us to improve further.

COVID-19 cases

We have had six student cases of COVID-19 in the past three weeks at school and nearly 170 students have had to isolate. We want to remind all members of the school community to follow our health and safety procedures so that we can keep each other safe. Students self isolating should be able to access their lessons on Google Classroom.

E-SCOOTERS ANDTHELAW

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E-SCOOTERS AND THE LAW

What is the law on e-scooters?

Currently in the UK, you can legally buy an e-scooter, but you cannot ride it on a public road, cycle lane or pavement. The only place it can be used is on private land.

The reason for this is that e-scooters are treated as motor vehicles by the Department of Transport and are subject to the same legal requirement as other vehicles, such as MOT, licencing, tax and insurance. Because they don't always have number plates, signalling ability or visible rear lights, they cannot be used legally on the roads.

What happens if I am stopped by the police?

The police will advise you on the law and may ask you to take your e-scooter home. They may, however, still penalise you depending on the seriousness of the offence. If caught riding an e-scooter, fines you may receive can include:

- a Fixed Penalty Notice for no insurance, with a £300 fine and six penalty points
- a Fixed Penalty Notice for no driving licence, up to £100 fine and three-six penalty points

Other offences which may result in penalties include riding on the footpath, using a mobile phone, riding through red lights and drink driving offences.
