AMAZON FUTURE ENGINEER BURSARY

The Royal Academy of Engineering is working with Amazon to launch a new Amazon Future Engineer bursary scheme in the UK. The bursary will support female students from low-income households studying computer science and related engineering courses at university.

Twelve awards, worth £5,000 a year for up to four years, will be made available to students progressing from A-level or technical education courses to university for the 2021/22 academic year. The new bursaries will help students who demonstrate a drive and passion for computing and engineering, and an understanding of how innovation and creativity in these fields can help solve some of the world's greatest challenges.

- How do we do physics?



LIVE VIRTUAL NHS HEALTHCARE WORK EXPERIENCE

Recently, students at Highlands have been participating in Live Virtual NHS Work Experience for Allied Health Careers which includes:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Paramedicine
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Dietetics, Radiography
- Prosthetics and orthotics
- Speech and language therapy
- Osteopathy
- Pharmacy and Podiatry

This programme is available to support all aspiring healthcare students as an alternative to in-person NHS work experience during the pandemic. During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and also each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching.

This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and their healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community.

BEWARE PARENTS AND STUDENTS: KIDNAPPING ATTEMPT AROUND ENFIELD

This week police officers in Enfield carried out enquiries to find a 10-year-old boy, who was reported missing on the morning of Tuesday 18th May. The boy was located and returned home on the same day.

Police are aware of reports circulating that the boy may have potentially been abducted. Officers are continuing to conduct extensive enquiries to establish the circumstances of the alleged abduction and whether any offence has occurred.

Officers are also aware of reports of a suspicious incident that occurred on Saturday, 15 May in the Enfield Lock area involving a white van. Officers traced the occupants of the van and arrested a man and a woman on suspicion of attempted child abduction. The man and woman have been bailed to return on a date in mid-June.

At this time police are not linking reports of the alleged abduction of the 10-year-old boy and reports of the suspicious incident in Enfield Lock involving the white van. As such, officers are continuing to investigate the two matters separately.

Detective Chief Superintendent Treena Fleming, in charge of policing for Enfield and Haringey, said: "I would like to reassure my local community that we take all allegations of this nature very seriously; we understand the concerns and strength of feeling, particularly amongst parents, when we hear of potential incidents involving children.

"I am aware, understandably, that there has been a great deal of coverage and concern expressed on social media around these two incidents but I would respectfully ask the local community to allow us to complete a full and thorough investigation around both matters. This will ensure that we are able to fully understand what may have occurred.

"If I do have any concerns around public safety, I will ensure that our residents and communities are made aware of my concerns, should this be necessary. When I know the full circumstances of what has happened in these alleged incidents, I will be sure to update the community.

"You will continue to see officers out and about across Enfield and I would encourage the public to speak with them about any concerns they may have. I would also suggest those living in the area to follow the @MPSEnfield account on Twitter, which is used by officers to engage with the community.

"Child kidnappings or abductions are incredibly rare and I must stress that we are still establishing the full facts around these cases to determine whether any offences have been committed. However, if anyone sees anything suspicious, or has any concerns, they should **dial 999** in an emergency or **call 101** in a non-emergency."
