

Well done to Regan and his family for supporting him during the trials in order to make this happen.



Personal maths tuition - Complete Mathematics Tutor

Dear parent/carer,

We are writing to let you know that we have signed students up to an online maths platform called TUTOR.

TUTOR will help your child revise and improve their maths through a mixture of videos and quizzes — it is easy to use, and your child will have unlimited access to all of the online lessons.

What is Complete Mathematics TUTOR?

Complete Mathematics TUTOR is an online maths platform designed to be an affordable, but equally effective, alternative to private tuition. TUTOR covers every level of maths from learning to count all the way up to calculus, and pupils can choose to follow a set course, or let TUTOR choose the right starting point for them. TUTOR breaks maths topics down into points called 'Goals' that together make up the whole Map of Maths.

Every Goal follows the same learning sequence: based on evidence of how we learn and drawing on the neuroscience of memory, we can assess the underlying (or 'pre-requisite') knowledge needed for each point on the map, and then through expert instruction, practice questions and quizzing, make sure that point is learned and remembered, in around 15-20 mins.

TUTOR contains over 1600 Goals, so there will always be a new topic for pupils to explore!

How can I support my child using TUTOR?

You can support your child by encouraging them to log in from home and work through the videos and quizzes available to them.

Your child's teacher can also see how many quizzes they have completed, and which courses they are working on — this means teachers can use the information from TUTOR to support your child in their maths lessons even more effectively.

From 22nd November to 3rd December 2021 year 7 and 8 students will sit mid-year assessments for the majority of their subjects.


Most assessments will take place during normal lesson time under exam conditions. Some will take place in the sports hall.

To celebrate and honour Hackney's Windrush Generation, three sculptures of Caribbean fruits were unveiled earlier this month to commemorate the Caribbean community who migrated to the UK in 1948.

Sixth Form Open Evening

We warmly invite prospective year 12 families to our open evening on Wednesday 17th November. There will be three arrival times, 5:30pm, 6:30pm and 7:30pm. Families must book a place at one of these times. Further details can be found on our website, here.





As part of the extended curriculum, students at Highlands can opt to take LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts) Solo Acting examinations. These popular classes are open to all students who are keen to develop their acting skills and/or build confidence as well as gain a valuable qualification.

LAMDA exams are internationally recognised qualifications. They are graded according to age and experience with higher grades carrying UCAS points.

Classes are run by an external provider on a peripatetic basis and take place on Wednesday afternoons after timetabled lessons have finished (see timetable, below). Highlands students benefit from an extremely favourable school rate of £10 per week, payable termly or monthly*. Students are taught in small groups in preparation for solo or combined examinations. Exams take place once a year, in the summer term.
