From the Headteacher

This week we celebrated LGBT+ History Month through a series of assemblies. LGBT+ History Month is an annual month-long observance of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history, and the history of the gay rights and related civil rights movements. The 2022 LGBT+ History Month celebrates 50 years since the first Pride event in the UK. This week staff at school wore rainbow Pride lanyards and staff and students wore rainbow badges. Next week we will send home a special LBGT+ newsletter and there will be form time activities around the topic.

PE kit

This week we had a focus on students coming to school in appropriate PE kit. This was because some students, mainly boys in years 10 and 11, were wearing other sportswear and tracksuits, rather than Highlands PE kit. I have checked with our uniform suppliers and they are fully stocked with our PE kit, so all students should have full kit. Students who do not have full PE kit should come to school in their normal school uniform, bring their kit in a bag, and get changed in PE. Students who come to school in other sportswear / tracksuits / non Highlands PE kit will be removed from lessons and we will ask their parents or carers to bring their uniform to school, which they can then wear for the rest of the day.

British Biology Olympiad

Competition dates: 2 – 16 March 2022

The BBO challenges and stimulates students with an interest in biology to expand their talents. it enables students to demonstrate their talent and to be suitable rewarded with publicly recognised certificates.



- 60% of students receive a commendation and above
- flexible timetable to suit all needs

The BBO is open to students in post-16 education studying at school or college. The competition consists of two, 45-minute multiple choice papers to be taken online under staff supervised exam conditions. Students will be presented with topics and ideas which they are not familiar with, so will compete with their problem solving skills and understanding of core principals from their A level Biology curriculum.

In addition to encouraging and rewarding pupils in their studies, the BBO is the first stage in selecting a team to represent the UK at the International Biology Olympiad (IBO). The IBO seeks to challenge both theory and practical tests with some of the top pre-university biology students in the world, and over sixty countries taking part. The top-scoring students in the BBO will be invited to complete further practical and theoretical training and assessments in order to select a team to represent the UK at the International Biology Olympiad (IBO)
