In these assemblies we gave out end of term awards and we received an update on the inter house competition. You can read details about these things below. Every year in education feels unique but 2021 really has been an unusual and challenging year. I want to thank the staff of Highlands for their perseverance and commitment to the school and our students. I particularly want to pay tribute to the staff who have time and time again covered for absent colleagues and taught cover lessons or taught multiple classes in the assembly hall in order that students are taught by a specialist member of staff.

COVID did not stop our students achieving excellent GCSE and A level results in the summer and we were proud of our students in years 10, 11 and 13 who did so well in their qualifications. We were determined to move on from COVID as far as possible as the year went on and we did this with the launch of our DARE days in October. In the past fortnight COVID and the new variant has really started to impact our ability to keep the school open but we have managed to do so. Great credit should go to our students who have still maintained good focus in lessons even though we have had significant staff absence.

This Christmas we say goodbye to some colleagues who are leaving us and we wish them well in the future. Ms Sheth is leaving our admin team. Ms White is leaving as our assistant SENCO. Ms Ace, one of our computing teachers, is leaving us. Mr Lopez-Dominguez is leaving the MFL department. Ms Gray, from the safeguarding team, is also leaving us. Ms Boon is leaving us as a member of staff in the Hearing Impaired Base.

One more member of staff who is leaving us is Ms Deb-Biswas, who has led our Hearing Impaired Base and taught history at Highlands for over a decade. Highlands is an exceptional example of comprehensive education and we pride ourselves on being an inclusive school. The Hearing Impaired Base (HIB) is at the heart of our school and at the heart of our commitment to inclusion. Under Ms Deb Biswas' leadership the HIB has supported dozens of students as they have successfully made their way through secondary school. We wish her all the best in future.

This time last year, when writing the end of term message to the school community, I wrote about wishing that everyone would stay safe from the virus. I had hoped, as I am sure everyone hoped, that this year we would be past COVID. However, once again I am wishing you all a happy and restful Christmas, but also one during which you are all safe.

Please could we also take this opportunity to remind students of the following:

Extra curricular Clubs

As a school we are delighted to offer a range of extra curricular clubs to give our students additional opportunities to lead an active and healthy lifestyle. Consequently, if your child would like to attend these extra curricular clubs we must receive parental/carer consent. These extra curricular clubs take place at the end of the school day.

Without your consent, your child will not be able to attend an extra curricular club. Should you wish to change the consent for your child for an extra curricular club then please inform the teacher of that club.

Please note that a parental consent form must be filled out each half term in order for your child to attend an extracurricular club. This means if you have previously filled out a consent form for last term and your child wishes to join the same (or a new) club next term, then you must fill in a new consent form.

Pupils should come to school in their school uniform unless they have PE on the day they also have an extra curricular club. The changing rooms will be opened at the end of the school day to allow pupils to change from their school uniform into their PE kit, should they need to use them.

Year 7 ed'extra is treated separately from the rest of the extracurricular timetable. The deadline to sign your child up for an extracurricular club is Friday 7th January, 3pm. Clubs are based on a first come first serve basis except for clubs where the teacher may invite specific pupils. Email confirmation of your child's place at a club will be sent out as soon as possible after Friday 7th January.

Safer Schools team Enfield and Haringey Schools Policing Date: 16th Nov 2021.

Dear Parent or Carer,

This letter covers the concerns around the use of TikTok by children.

I would like to share with you that there have been a number of incidents in various schools where school children have been posting malicious information about school staff on social media platforms such as TikTok. On occasions this has included falsely accusing staff of criminal offences involving children.

This is very distressing to staff and their families a behaviour that is not acceptable. Please may I respectfully ask you as parents and carers for us to work together to remind your child that this is a criminal offence under the Malicious Communications Act 1988:

Where a person sends a letter, electronic communication or article of any description which conveys a message which is indecent or grossly offensive, a threat or information which is false and known or believed to be false by the sender is a criminal offence.

If a child writes something about a member of school staff which is false or grossly offensive 'just as a bit of fun' or as a rumour and then posts it on social media – they do commit a criminal offence.

The child may then be at risk of permanently excluded and/or prosecution and risk of being criminalised resulting in a criminal record which will have an impact when they apply for a job in the future.

As your safer schools police team, we work hard with your school to avoid school children becoming excluded or criminalised, but sometimes where the level of harm or distressed caused is so severe we have little choice but to follow these routes.

The importance of sharing this communication with you is for us to work together to both educate and engage with you to avoid this situation.

Please speak to your child regarding the sensible use of social media. Please consider also using parental software to restrict to manage what they can access and monitor where appropriate. A guide can be found on line. I may also look to arrange one of our schools officers to host a virtual on line awareness session to assist you.

Although this letter is focusing on TikTok the <u>content is relevant for other risks social media poses</u> such as your child being at risk of being exploited, bullied, and groomed on line by criminal gangs.

If your child does genuinely suspect of anyone committing criminal offences then they must report this to either a senior staff member, or the police. You or your child can also confidentially access Childline 0800 1111 childline.org.uk or report crime anonymously via the Fearless website. Fearless.org
