News from the Science Department

During the Summer term I have been running an after school Science Club at our PEA partner school Wilbury. The activities have been for year 5 pupils and our Sixth Formers have assisted me in delivering the sessions. The club has been very successful and will be repeated next year.

On 6th July the Science Department delivered the, now annual, Science Day at Wilbury Primary School. Mr Levinson, Mr Antonis, Ms Al-Obaidi, Mr Howells and Mr Smith delivered 3 separate sessions throughout the day, covering all 3 scientific areas. The year 6 pupils made rockets, extracted their DNA and completed a CSI. Both staff and pupils enjoyed the day.

On 5th July Highlands School Science Department hosted 90 year 5 pupils from Grange Park. This was part of the Science Department's outreach work with local schools. This offers the chance for primary school students to take part in science experiences they would not normally have access to.

The pupils were split into three groups who took part in three sessions based around the three sciences. In the Physics Room pupils were able to test out electrostatic equipment including the popular Van de Graff generator. Whilst in the Chemistry room pupils took part in a rainbow fizz practical, testing how accurate they are in measuring different chemicals. Finally, in the Biology Room, pupils used Microscopes with prepared slides and items such as newspaper print, salt crystals and sand, offering them a view of the microscopic world.

It was clear from the pupils' reactions that they enjoyed the event and I want to say a big thank you to all the staff in the Science Department who made the morning a great success.
